

## Teaching and Learning - Basics in English

(also part of the SU-University Didactics Programme, module: electives of higher education didactics competencies)

**Target groups:** academic teachers and scientists

**Contents:** The range of scientific courses is increasingly moving in an international environment. Students from all over the world can learn and interact with one another in face-to-face, hybrid and e-learning courses.

In this workshop we would like to give academic teachers and scientists the opportunity to reflect on themselves as teachers in English and to try out themselves as academic teachers in English. The seminar is suitable for both international English-speaking and German-speaking academic teachers who offer teaching and learning in English and / or who want to move confidently with the relevant English-language vocabulary in the field of teaching and learning.

**Single course, programme, certificate:** You can also attend the workshop as an individual seminar regardless of the subsequent certificate. For the full and dedicated attendance of a single course from 5 work units you will receive a competence-based proof of participation from the University Didactics Unit at Saarland University. This workshop is one of the workshops of the module "Electives of Higher Education Didactics Competencies" of the Saarland University's Certificate of Teaching in Higher Education.

The certificate comprises a total of three modules (modules: core workshops of higher education competencies, electives of higher education competencies, collegial coaching and teaching portfolio) at least 120 work units or at least 3x40 work units.
